REP PROGRAM

260 athletes were selected to represent Ariels VCNA in 20 Teams across our Victorian Netball League (VNL) and representative netball programs, comprising three VNL (Championship, Division 1, and 19&U), 1 VNL Squad, 3 Development Teams, 14 Representative Teams and Four M-League Teams.

Our 17 Teams (1 x VNL Squad and 17 x Development/Representative) registered to participate in WNNA's 2023 Autumn and Spring Season competitions.

Our VNL Teams competed in the Victorian Netball League (VNL), Victoria's premier netball competition.

PRE-SEASON CAMP

The annual representative pre-season camp in 2023 was held at CYC The Island from 4-5 February, with 153 athletes and 17 coaches attending. The camp provided the opportunity for players and coaches to get to know each other through a range of fun team building exercises, and physical activities. The 11&U squad attended an all-day session on the Saturday.

ARIELS TOURNAMENT

Our annual tournament was held at the Knox Regional Netball Centre in March. The centre was undergoing extensive renovations and given the restrictions and challenges we faced, the day was very successful. A representative from Netball Victoria came out to assist us in the morning as we were one of the first Associations to use live scoring at a tournament.

MILDURA NETBALL CARNIVAL

We had 7 teams represent Ariels at the Mildura Netball Carnival and we hired two buses to transport 70 athletes and 20 adults (including coaches & umpires) over the 4 days. Four teams competed in semi-finals and one team made it to the grand final. We all stayed at a caravan park and it was a successful and enjoyable weekend for all.

PRESENTATION NIGHT

This year's Presentation Night was held at the Manhattan Hotel. With 200 attendees, it was a great evening for our athletes and their families to celebrate their achievements throughout the year. Our Silent Auction was supported by generous donations from community members and local businesses, and many families went home with amazing prizes.

With a mixture of returning players and new players the teams bonded well at Camp in Shepparton where they trained hard, set goals and played practice matches.

Unfortunately, we didn't have the success on court that we were hoping for with teams finishing near the bottom of the ladder in each division.

We had 2 home games held at Maroondah Nets and thank all our Ariels players, families and supporters for attending and cheering on our teams. We raised money for Pink Day with our Mother's Day matches and show cased our men's teams in an exhibition match.

The end of the 2023 season saw the VNL license period end and application process begin for the next 5 year license period. Unfortunately, we were unsuccessful in renewing our license after holding it for 15 years.

We congratulate all players and coaches who have continued with their VNL journey into 2024.

Thank you to everyone involved in our VNL program over the past 15 years, we couldn't have done it without you, and we appreciate your dedication to Ariels.

Ariels will continue to grow and develop players with the goal of getting them to VNL and I am excited to see the association continue to grow and perform on the netball court over the next few years.

MLEAGUE REPORT

We fielded four teams in M League last season: Premier Men's, Premier Mixed, Division 1 Men's and Division 1 Mixed. Unfortunately, we didn't get enough players to form a junior boy's team, but we remain hopeful that we may be able to field a junior team in the 2024 season.

Both our Men's teams missed the finals but played some very high-level netball in their respective sections. In particular the Premier Men's team were very competitive in a competition in which the standard increases every season.

Our Division 1 Mixed team made the finals for the 5th year running, but unfortunately were knocked out in the first week of the finals.

Our Premier Mixed team made the Premier finals for the first time, in only our second year in the competition, but also had a narrow loss in the Elimination final after having led for most of the match. This was an outstanding effort given we had three of our original players miss most of the season with long term injuries, which forced us to rely on fill-in players. My understanding is that this was the first Ariels team to make finals in a State League competition (either VNL or M League) in approximately 10 years.

I'm very pleased to report that seven of our male players were selected in either Open age or junior State teams for this year's National Championships, along with one male and one female who were also selected as Training Partners.

I would also like to acknowledge our Division 1 coaches, Kurt Thompson (Men), and Charlotte Davies (Mixed), and thank them for their effort and input over the season.

In summary, we are making good progress with the M League program; our Mixed teams are doing well and we will be looking for our Men's teams to continue their improvement and move up the ladder in each section.

Notes to the Financial Statements

ARIELS VCNA

For the year ended 30 September 2023

1. Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

The Committee have determined that the Association is not a reporting entity and accordingly, this financial report is a special purpose report prepared for the sole purpose of distributing a financial report to members and must not be used for any other purpose. The Committee have determined that the accounting policies adopted are appropriate to meet the needs of the members.

The financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis and under the historical cost convention, except for certain assets, which, as noted, have been written down to fair value as a result of impairment. Unless otherwise stated, the accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the prior year.

The accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of the statements are as follows:

Trade and Other Receivables

Trade receivables and other receivables, including distributions receivable, are recognised at the nominal transaction value without taking into account the time value of money. If required a provision for doubtful debt has been created.

Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the company that remain unpaid at 30 September 2023. Trade payables are recognised at their transaction price. They are subject to normal credit terms and do not bear interest.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held on call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts.

Revenue Recognition

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon the delivery of goods to customers.

Revenue from the rendering of services is recognised upon the delivery of the services to customers.

Revenue from commissions is recognised upon delivery of services to customers.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Goods and Services Tax

Transactions are recognised net of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the balance sheet.

- Advertising up \$7k New website \$5k investment
